

Welcome New Members



Kathy Zieman used her winnings from the Pillsbury Bake Off to buy Como Golf Course. The first thing she did was to install a zip line to navigate the hills.


Lori Phillips joined a traveling Mexican Train team. She is now playing for more than nickels and dimes.
